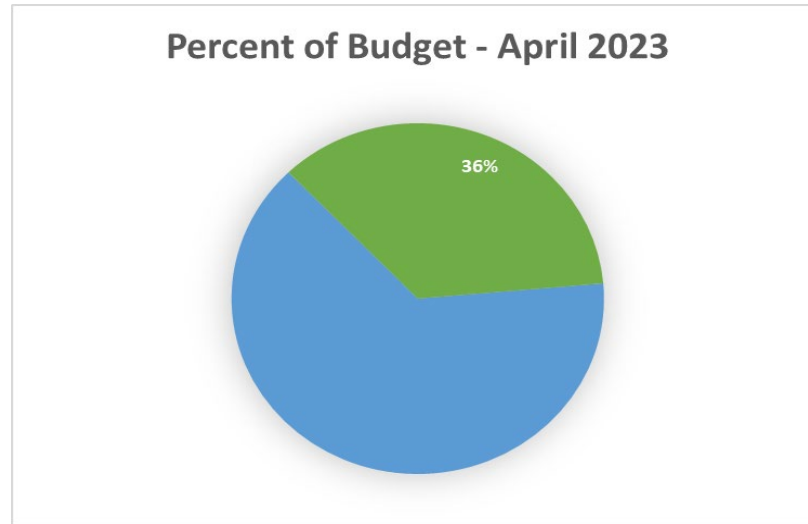
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Financial Report

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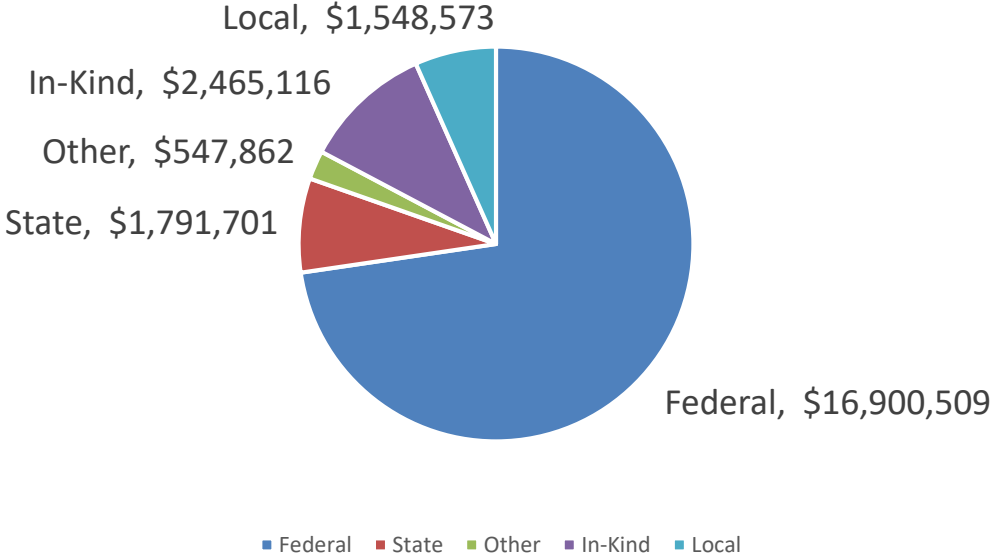


FY 2023-2024 Annual Combined Budget



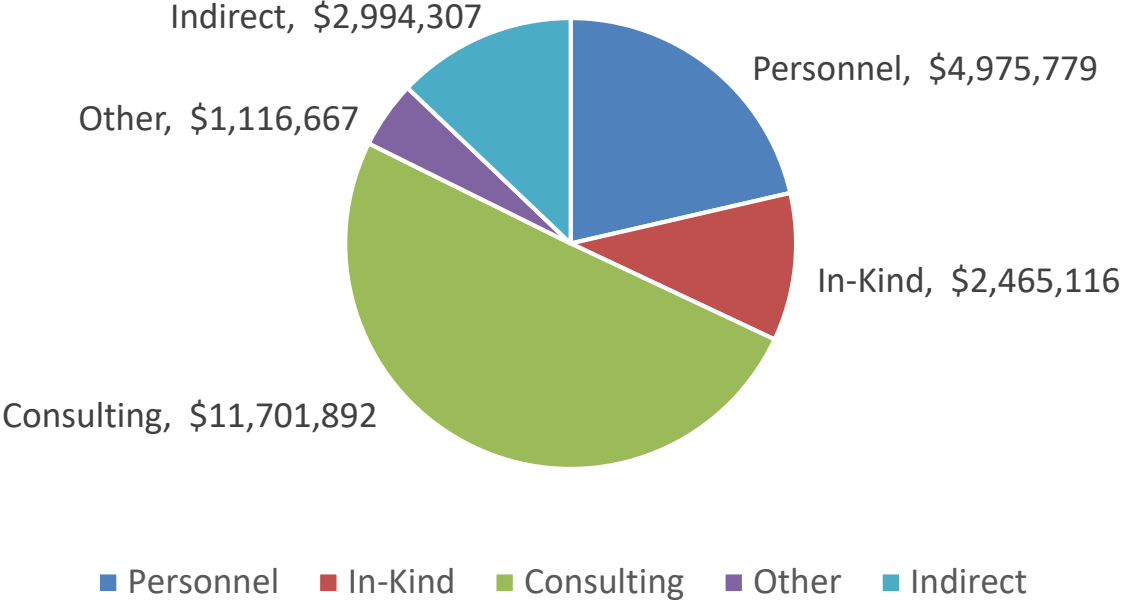
FY 23-24 Funding Sources

- FY 23-24 budget is \$23,253,761; \$912,736 above FY22/23 budget and includes:
 - Grant Support from ARC, DOD/PTAC, EDA, EPA, FHWA, FTA, PA DCED and PennDOT, with additional competitive opportunities being continuously considered.
 - Approved increase in SPC Member Local Dues and unchanged Water Resource Dues
 - 55 full-time staff positions
 - No anticipated changes to current fringe benefits package
 - Staff performance based merit increases effective 7/1/2023
 - Current approved Indirect Costs Allocation Plan of 51.5252%
 - A new plan will be submitted to PennDOT for review and approval by the end of July.
 - New plan/rate will cover the unallocated overhead listed above.

New Federal Funding

SPC Administered: Carbon Reduction Program

The purpose of the Carbon Reduction Program (CRP) is to reduce transportation carbon dioxide emissions through the development of State carbon reduction strategies and by funding projects designed to reduce transportation emissions (See 23 U.S.C. 175 as established by the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) (Public Law 117-58, also known as the “Bipartisan Infrastructure Law” (BIL)).

Type: Reimbursement

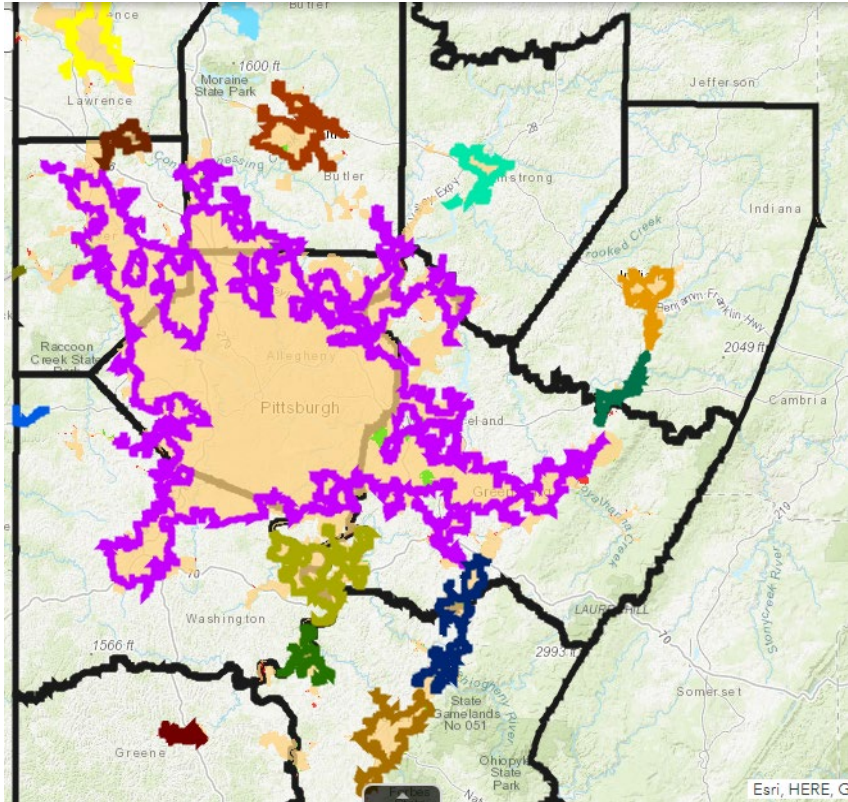
Match: 20%

Available Funding: Approximately \$4.5 million/year, region-wide. Projects selected through competitive application process every two years

Other: Must reduce transportation carbon dioxide emissions. Must be consistent with regional long range transportation plan.

Eligible Applicants: CMAQ & TA Sponsors

Urbanized Areas Boundary Determination



An urbanized area is a geographical area consisting of a central core and adjacent settled territory that together contain at least 50,000 people with an overall population density of 1,000 people per square mile.

- Co-Hosted Duquesne Light Electric Fleet Expo with Duq. Light – Panel Discussion on Funding opportunities

- **Sponsored Programs Development:**

- Application period is now open for CMAQ, TA Set Aside, and Carbon Reduction. Please connect with us if you have project ideas!

- **Environmental Programs**

- Climate Pollution Reduction Grant (CPRG) NOIP and Work Plan have been submitted to the EPA. Our consultant scope of work is in draft and we plan to finalize in the next few days.
- Completed 3 MS4 certification trainings; now a 5-year Certified Stormwater Permit Inspector for PA, with additional “qualified inspector” training for construction permits, low-impact development and green infrastructure.
- Participating in regional EV discussions with City of Pittsburgh, Allegheny Cty, Quaker Valley COG; attended SWPA Decarbonization Forum, SWPA Electric Fleet Expo and SWPA Energy Summit.

Strategic Initiatives & Policy – Dept. Update

- **Freight Planning:**
 - Army Corps Meeting held in May, progress being made on Allegheny River including possible SPC lead involvement
 - Next Meeting is in mid-July
- **Active Transportation:**
 - Continue to support Delmont Borough and the City of Monongahela as they move forward with development of Active Transportation Plans
 - Revision of draft Complete Streets Policy in progress -final draft to be shared with the Commissioners Active Transportation and Complete Streets working group for review/feedback
 - 2023 Nonmotorized Data Collection Program -request for counts received from Pitt and Delmont Borough as of this date

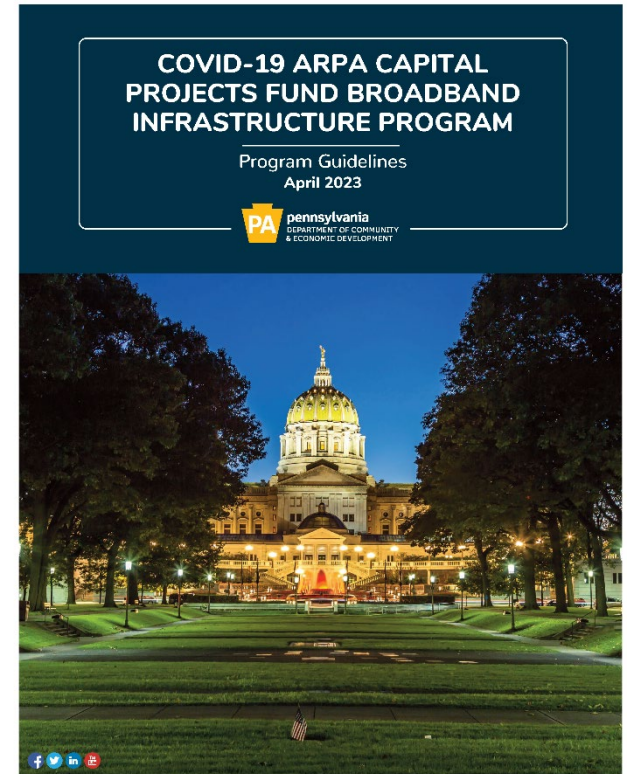


Small Business Broadband Connectivity Survey and Strategy Guide Update

- Kick off meeting held with PBDA and PREP partners on April 26th .
- Survey in final draft stage and will launch in July.
- Survey Goals (15 questions):
 - Evaluate how businesses use (or don't use) high-speed internet in everyday operations.
 - Understand key factors that hinder business growth.
 - Understand what tools and resources would spur business growth.
- Project on schedule to wrap up by the end of the year.

Funding Opportunities

- Pennsylvania Broadband Development Authority – Capital Projects Broadband Infrastructure Program
 - \$200M from federal American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA)
 - Open May 10 – July 10, 2023
 - Awards: \$500k - \$10M (25% match required)
 - Applicants: Businesses, Non-Profits, Local Governments, Economic Development Organizations
 - Projects: Broadband infrastructure projects delivering 100/100 service in unserved or underserved areas
 - **DEADLINE EXTENDED: August 9, 2023**

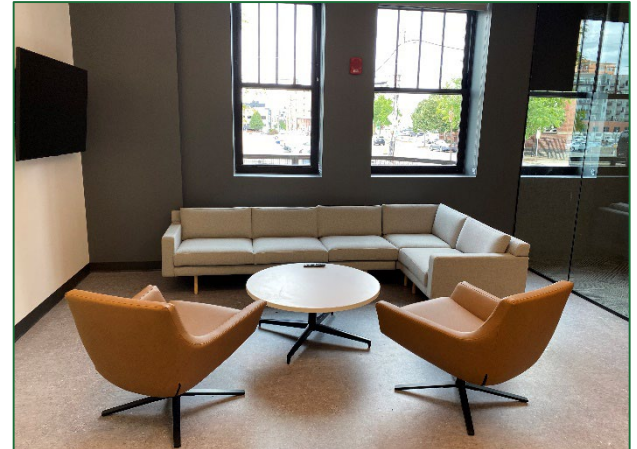
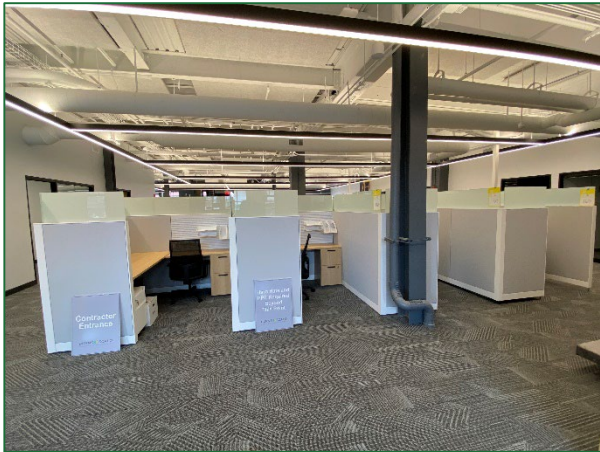
